PASTOR'S POINTS

A time for collective reflection



March 2nd marks the start of the season of Lent. This season of reflection and repentance officially begins at

sundown and has for centuries been commemorated with the Ash Wednesday service, which includes the imposition of ashes.

While it may seem odd to some in the 21st century that we'd mark our foreheads with ashes as a sign of humility and repentance, this ancient practice draws us back to the time of Christ and even centuries before, when faithful communities were considerably more collectively minded, rather than the hyperfocused individualism we see within our world today. The use of sackcloth and ashes in ancient faith communities was not just a way of identifying those within the community that were in mourning or seeking repentance, it also served as a cue to the whole community that this is a time for collective reflection and support. This is what St. Paul writes about in 1 Corinthians where we read, "If one member suffers, all suffer together with it; if one member is honored, all rejoice together with it." (1 Corinthians 12:26, NRSV)

St. Paul's connection between the actions of the faith communities of old and the faithful in Christ as members of Christ's body echo into our modern times, as well. While our society as a whole may not take on the same types of public displays of mourning or repentance, within our faith communities we can still surround one another in prayer and mutual support.

After all, since we are all equally members of Christ's body and, by extension, members of each other, we are only at our best when the whole body is striving for mutual care and support of each of its parts. As we enter into this season of Lent, I ask that we be willing to open our hearts and minds to how God is calling us to care for Christ's body in our community and in our world. May our prayers be of support and compassion for the whole body of Christ and may our actions reflect the work of the Holy Spirit gathering us in and sending us out with God's own grace, mercy and love. Amen.

Annual Meeting highlights

The Annual Congregational Meeting was held January 23rd after worship. A quorum of 55 active members (31 in person and 24 on Zoom) were in attendance.

REPORT OF THE TREASURER

St. John's received a check from the Charles Morris estate in the amount of \$100,000. \$15,000 was deposited in the Contingency account for future use, and \$85,000 was deposited in a seperate account with ELCA. To date, the church has not needed any money transferred.

A very generous member of the church matched up to \$8,000 to help with the church's expenses. Member offerings with this match were \$14,215. With the match, a total of \$22,215 was donated.

The 2022 budget reflects a 2 percent increase for salaries of all employees, a 16.5 percent expected increase in offerings and a 7 percent increase for expenditures.

NOMINATIONS & ELECTIONS

Denise Norman, Dave Geil, Christine Murphy and

Lois Rowzee were nominated to the Congregational Council. A motion was made by Dave Geil to approve the nominees by unanimous vote. The motion passed, and all nominees were voted onto the council.

Shawn Wolfe and Art Frey were nominated and approved to the Endowment Committee.

Denise Norman and Shawn Wolfe will be St. John's delegates with Kandra Cook as an alternate as voting members for the 2022 Synod Assembly.

BUSINESS

A motion to approve the 2022 budget as printed in the Annual Report was made by Dave Geil with a second by Jan Klocke. Motion carried.
