Early registration for the gathering begins September 22nd. We anticipate the gathering will cost around \$1,000 per participant. FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

Applications opened July 22nd and close when all funds have been disbursed.

Adult leaders should apply on behalf of youth participants, using the same five-digit congregational ID number used to register for the Gathering.

Financial assistance is available to youth participants only in the form of registration fee credits.

Assistance is offered based on the financial need of youth participants and their families, not the financial status of their congregations or local communities.

Up to \$300 per youth participant may be provided to cover registration fees. Financial assistance will appear as a credit on the congregational account.

Congregations may receive assistance for up to 10 youth.

Youth participants must be registered within 30 days of receiving financial assistance. After 30 days, assistance for unregistered youths is returned to the fund and awarded to the next person on the waiting list.

Contact Gerad at the church office if you are interested in applying for Youth Gathering financial assistance. If you receive ELCA financial assistance, this will offset your outof-pocket expense for the gathering.

NURSE NOTES

Get your calcium

Women older than 50 and men older than 71 generally need at least 1,200 milligrams of calcium daily to protect their bone health.

For those who choose not to consume dairy, or have limited choices due to lactose intolerance or other health issues, many different foods can help you reach your daily recommended amount of calcium. As you look at the following list, keep in mind that 8 ounces of milk contains about 300 milligrams of calcium. Here are some of the foods to consider adding to your diet, along with serving sizes and milligrams of calcium for each:

- Calcium-fortified tofu, ½ cup, 435 mg
- ·Broccoli raab, 1 cup, 360 mg
- •Sardines, canned with bones, 3 oz, 325 mg
- Fortified almond, rice, or soy milk, 8 oz, 300 mg
- Fortified orange juice, 8 oz, 300 mg
- Waffle, frozen and fortified, 2 pieces, 200 mg
- •Salmon, canned with bones, 3 oz, 180 mg
- •Kale, cooked, 1 cup, 100mg
- •Collard greens, frozen, 1 cup, 85 mg

The calcium content for most foods can vary. When possible, check the product's nutrition label to determine its calcium content. Updated nutrition labels, now on most products, will tell you the amount of calcium in a product, in addition to the percent daily value of calcium a serving provides.
