YOUTH & FAMILY MINISTRIES

Sunday school planning is under way, and masks will be required indoors. Surfaces will be sanitized and disinfected. During warmer months, Sunday school will meet outside under pop-up tents or in shaded areas in the grass. Rally Day will be September 19th after outdoor worship.

A Confirmation meeting was held in August, and the first class will be the third Wednesday of September. Jersey, Martin and Brynna will be confirmed on October 24th.

Earlybird registration for the 2022 ELCA Youth Gathering opens soon, and Gerad is waiting on a final decision regarding whether the event will happen since COVID numbers are on the rise. A Butcher Shop fundraiser is being planned.

The church will use Church Mutual, our insurance company, at \$5 per person to provide basic background checks on youth program volunteers.

St. John's will be offered as a shared space for Lenten services for Tri-Church.

COMMUNICATIONS

Michelle Gawlik offered some great ideas for outreach and advertising for the church. Andrew Stutzke will do a Temple Talk about the recent meeting with Pastor Gary Erickson.

OLD BUSINESS

Council discussed how to continue the idea of creating a Prayer Garden. A committee will be formed to gather ideas. Seed money will need to come from memorials or gifts from the congregation.

JULY MEETING

Editor's Note: In the August newsletter, in the absence of the full minutes of the meeting, we published only highlights. Below are more details.

REPORT OF THE PASTOR

VBS went well. Many volunteered and attended. More than 35 people participated in God's Work Our Hands Saturday at LOMC and did more than they committed to do. There was also a great turnout for the most recent junior high and high school gatherings.

UNITE Camp houses will be finished by the end of the week.

Synod Assembly was on Zoom this year, and the Synod plans a more traditional assembly for 2022 at Augustana College in Rock Island. Bishop Jeff Clements will only serve one term, so he is not putting his name forward for next year.

REPORT OF THE TREASURER

No transfers were made during the month of June. Balance in the checking account as of June 30th was \$24,425.81.

The Betty Huntley Memorial provided \$210 in unrestricted funds.

St. John's was one of 10 recipients of \$100,000 from the Charles
D. Morris estate. Charles' wife,

Patricia's (Meenen) father was a member of St. John's in the 1950s.

Recommendations:

- •\$100,000 from Charles D. Morris estate \$15,000 to the contingency account
- •\$85,000 recommend placed in ELCA 2-3 percent interest; two-week turnover to access funds if needed.
- Above and Beyond \$11,745.00 with match of \$8,000; total is \$19,745
- Going forward asking for a current total in account instead of from a few weeks before.

COMMUNICATIONS

Nancy Davis has been moved to assisted living at Morningside and can have visitors.

OLD BUSINESS

The Prayer Garden award was not granted to our church. There was an overwhelming response with 1,000 entries and only 123 randomly drawn. It is worth investing time and energy into completing it.

Congregation members present at the meeting had a handful of questions and comments:

- · What are we doing to cut expenses?
- Has anything been done to reach out to members who have left? A suggestion was made for a personal visit from Pastor Jacob, and to keep trying to reach out, possibly even sending a letter to say we miss them.
- A few members questioned why they were not contacted by Pastor Jacob and only Pastor Leo.
- What does the Synod think of us?
- Do we need a full-time secretary?

NURSE NOTES Dealing with depression

Once you understand that depression isn't something your loved one can easily manage without help, it may be more possible for you to offer support and care. Here are some ways you can help:

Express your concern.
Acknowledge the person's pain without implying that you know how he or she feels. Listen if he or she wants to talk, but don't try to draw the person out and don't ask intrusive questions. Being withdrawn is often part of the illness. Don't take it personally.

Ask how you can help. Your loved one may not have specific

suggestions of things that you can do, but he or she will know that you're willing to be supportive. Offer hope. Remind the individual that depression is treatable, and that he or she will likely get better. If your loved one is undergoing treatment, gently remind him or her that it takes time for treatment to work.

Give positive reinforcement.

Depressed people often feel
worthless, and they dwell on their
faults and shortcomings. Remind
your loved one of his or her
strengths and competencies and
how much he or she means to you.

Keep your sense of humor. You're likely to feel frustrated and even angry at times. That's OK, but try not to vent in front of the person and don't take your anger out on him or her. Use humor to diffuse tension and to lighten the atmosphere, but don't make jokes at your loved one's expense.

Encourage healthy behavior and activities. Invite your loved one to join you in doing activities or visiting family or mutual friends. But don't push and don't expect too much too soon. Also, gently remind the individual of the benefits of exercise and a healthy diet.
